If you manage credit in the co-op system; you won't want to miss this conference!

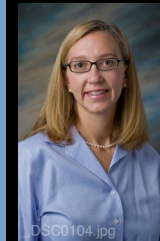

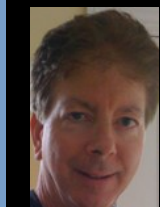
